### PRINCIPAL VISTA



**Education plays a significant and remedial role in balancing the socio-economic fabric of the Country**

**NAS stands for National Achievement Survey. It is the largest, nationwide, sample-based education survey conducted across India.**

**NCERT has initiated the National Achievement Survey (NAS) (school based survey) in 2017 for assessing the competencies of children at the grade levels 3, 5 and 8 in key curricular areas viz. Language, Mathematics, EVS/Science and Social Science.**

**It aims to “provide reliable information on the achievement of students in the elementary sector of education in government, government-aided schools and private schools”.**

National Achievement Survey-2021 is scheduled on 12th November 2021. The Survey goes beyond the scorecard and includes the background variables to correlate student's performance in different learning outcomes vis-a-vis contextual variables. This national level survey conducted by CBSE as Assessment Administrator for Grade 3, 5, 8 and 10 students. The Survey will be conducted in a monitored environment in the sampled schools. Sampling Design for NAS 2021 intends to support the predefined and agreed objectives of the national assessment: It intends to provide information of what India's students know and can do in key grades and subjects at national, state, district and school type.

## IMPORTANT NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL DAYS

### INTERNATIONAL FRIENDSHIP DAY

The International Day of Friendship was proclaimed in 2011 by the UN General Assembly with the idea of promoting international understanding and respect for diversity.

The International Day of Friendship is an initiative that follows on the proposal made by UNESCO defining the Culture of Peace as a set of values, attitudes and behaviours that reject violence and endeavour to prevent conflicts by addressing their root causes with a view to solving problems. It was then adopted by the UN General Assembly in 1997.

### Hiroshima Day

Hiroshima Day is observed every year on August 6 to promote peace politics and raise awareness of the effects of the bomb attack on Hiroshima.

Hiroshima city was attacked by an atomic weapon that killed thousands of lives instantly on August 6, 1945. This is the 76<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the atomic bombing of the Japanese city. It was the first city to be attacked by a nuclear bomb.

In 1945, the United Nations deployed a nuclear bomb to the city of Hiroshima. This wiped out 39 percent of the civilians in the city.



The US created two atomic bombs named 'The Little Boy' dropped in the city of Hiroshima and 'The Fat Man' in the city of Nagasaki on August 6 and 9 respectively.

This day plays a significant role as it focuses on anti-war and anti-nuclear demonstrations in many countries. On this day, people pay a visit to the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum that archives the atomic bombing of Hiroshima in the Second World War.

National lighthouse day is observed annually on



August 7, National Lighthouse Day honors the beacon of light that symbolized safety and security for ships and boats at sea, for hundreds of years.

At one time, the beacon of light could be found across almost all of America's shorelines.

On August 7, 1789, the United States Congress approved an act for the "establishment and support of Lighthouse, Beacons, Buoys, and Public Piers."

It was two hundred years later that Congress designated August 7 as National Lighthouse Day.

On National Watermelon day, the world celebrates



**a fruit that helps fight**

**cancer.** Studies show that the antioxidants - carotenoid and lycopene - contained in watermelons reduce the risk of some types of cancer.

Watermelon is one of the lowest fruits in terms of calories.

It provides 3% of the RDI (Recommended Daily Intake) in terms of vitamins B6, B5, and B1.

It also offers 4% of magnesium, 5% of potassium, 18% vitamin A, and 21% of Vitamin C as RDI

**Did you know that watermelon is 92 percent water with fiber?**

**International Cat Day** is a celebration which takes place on 8 August of every year. It was created in 2002 by the International Fund for Animal Welfare. It is a day of raising awareness for cats and learn about ways to help and protect them. In 2020 custodianship of International Cat Day passed to International Cat Care, a not-for-profit British organization that has been striving to improve the health and welfare of domestic cats worldwide since 1958.

Infinity Day was first conceived and created by

**Jean-Pierre Ady Fenyo,**

a philosopher, poet, journalist, and a science-fiction author. As a sidewalk philosopher, he became known back in 1987 as "The Original New York City Free Advice Man" (see [The New Yorker](#) magazine's August 17, 1987 issue.) Infinity Day was begun in 1987 and has been celebrated in the form of peaceful, non-violent and lawful demonstrations for philosophical inquiry, freedom of expression, freedom of speech and ethics in society, throughout the world. Thereafter the founder took it to various cities in the US and Europe.

It is a commemoration held on the 8th day of the 8th month of each year to celebrate and promote Philosophies of ordinary persons.



The International Day of the World's Indigenous People shall be observed on



9 August every year. The date marks the day of the first meeting, in 1982, of the UN Working Group on Indigenous Populations.

They are descendants from populations, who inhabited a country or a geographical region at the time of conquest and colonisation. They retain some or all of their own social, economic, cultural and political institutions, irrespective of their legal status. On this day, people from around the world are encouraged to spread the UN's message on the protection and promotion of the rights of indigenous peoples.



World Elephant Day is on August 12. World Elephant Day is an international initiative co-founded by the **Elephant Reintroduction Foundation** and **Patricia Sims, the Founding President of World Elephant Society.**

The World Elephant Day campaign is led by Patricia Sims. World Elephant Day has been created to bring the world together to help elephants.

It is a day to honor elephants, to spread awareness about the critical threats they are facing, and to support positive solutions that will help ensure their survival.

World Biofuel Day is observed every year on 10th August to create awareness



about the importance of non-fossil fuels as an alternative to conventional fossil fuels and to highlight the various efforts made by the Government in the biofuel sector. This day also honors the research experiments by Sir Rudolf Diesel who ran an engine with peanut oil in the year 1893. His research experiment had predicted that vegetable oil is going to replace fossil fuels in the next century to fuel different mechanical engines. The World Biofuel Day is being observed by the Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas since 2015.

## Independence

Day is celebrated annually on 15<sup>th</sup> August as a national holiday



in India, commemorating the nation's independence from the United Kingdom on 15 August 1947. On this day, the first Prime Minister of India, Jawaharlal Nehru raised the Indian national flag above the Lahori Gate of the Red Fort in Delhi. On each subsequent Independence Day, the incumbent Prime Minister customarily raises the flag and gives an address to the nation. India is celebrating its 75th Independence Day and marking another milestone in the history of the world's largest democracy. Addressing the nation from Red Fort, PM Modi said the Centre will soon launch the Rs 100 lakh-crore Gati Shakti national infrastructure plan to boost the country's economy. Giving a call for 'Sabka Prayas' along with 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas' for building a new India, PM Modi said, "We have to ensure we meet our goal of building Aatmanirbhar Bharat when we celebrate 100 years of India's Independence."



National Potato Day is on August 19. The potato is an unusual little tuber that has played an important role in the history of the world and was, in fact, the primary food crop for an entire nation. Potato Day celebrates this wonderful tuber and all the things you can use it for.



Each year on August 20th, National Radio Day recognizes the great invention of the radio.



In 1906, Reginald Fessenden created the first radio broadcast of voice and music purely for entertainment purposes aired. He transmitted the program from Brant Rock, MA, for the general public to hear. The Canadian-born scientist would go on to many more successes in his lifetime.

An American contributor to the radio, Lee de Forest, invented the Audion vacuum. This invention made live broadcasting possible. Born in [Iowa](#) in 1873, de Forest would become the chief scientist for the first U.S. radio firm, American Wireless Telephone, and Telegraph.

World Honey Bee Day on the third Saturday in August brings a buzzing celebration for beekeepers, honey lovers, and all blooming things. The day recognizes both the honey bee and the beekeepers who tend the hives. It also encourages everyone to enjoy and buy locally grown honey. World Honey Bee Day began as National Honey Bee Day in 2009 with a proclamation issued by the Secretary of Agriculture, Thomas J. Vilsack.



To raise awareness alertness about the disease caused by



mosquitos, World Mosquito Day is observed annually on 20 August. Despite being very small or tiny in size, mosquitoes are the only predator in history that has lived through centuries and caused death through vector-borne diseases like malaria. Due to their dangerous illness and disease, mosquitoes are counted among the world's deadliest that kills around 7 lakh people every year. Moreover, as per a survey of the world's deadliest animals, mosquitoes have topped the list. Other than creating awareness, World Mosquito Day remembers Sir Ronald Ross who discovered and exposed the link between female mosquitoes and malaria. **Theme for World Mosquito Day 2021 theme:**

This year amid the coronavirus pandemic, the theme of World Mosquito Day 2021 is "Reaching the zero-malaria target".

World Senior Citizen's Day is dedicated to the senior citizens and is observed on August 21 every year



across the world. This day is dedicated to raising awareness about the issues that affect older adults. On this day, we must appreciate the senior citizen's for their dedication, accomplishments, and the services they have given throughout their lives. World Senior Citizen's Day was officially founded by Ronald Reagan, the former President of the United States of America, after he had signed the Proclamation on August 19, 1988. On December 14, 1990, the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) proclaimed to observe 21 August as World Senior Citizens Day.

In his Presidential Proclamation, Ronald Regan said, "For all that they have achieved throughout their lives and for all that they continue to do, we owe our gratitude and sincere greetings to our senior citizens".

The night of 22 to 23 August 1791, in Santo



Domingo (today Haiti and the Dominican Republic) saw the beginning of the uprising that would play a crucial role in the abolition of the transatlantic slave trade. International Day for the Remembrance of the Slave Trade and its Abolition is commemorated every year on 23 August. The Day intends to inscribe the tragedy of the slave trade in the memory of all peoples. In accordance with the goals of the intercultural project "The Slave Route", it should offer an opportunity for collective consideration of the historic causes, the methods and the consequences of this tragedy, and for an analysis of the interactions to which it has given rise between Africa, Europe, the Americas and the Caribbean. The Director-General of UNESCO invites the Ministers of Culture of all Member States to organize events every year on that date, involving the entire population of their country and in particular young people, educators, artists and intellectuals.



On August 22nd, National Be An Angel Day encourages good deeds and kindness to others. By supporting those in need and inspiring others to kindness, we display an act of an angel here on earth. The day also recognizes those who've been angels to us. In 1993, JayneHoward Feldman created National Be An Angel Day to encourage the acts of kindness.



International Dog Day is celebrated annually on August 26 to respect and



celebrate every dog and to draw attention to the plight of canines and encourage adoption. Dogs are known as man's best friend. They love their owners unconditionally.

International Dog Day was started in the US in 2004 by pet and family lifestyle expert and animal rescue advocate Colleen Paige. She chose to observe the day on August 26 as it's the date that her family adopted their first dog 'Sheltie' from an animal shelter home. The website of National Dog Day describes their mission as "to help galvanize the public to recognize the number of dogs that need to be rescued each year and acknowledges family dogs and dogs that work selflessly each day to save lives, keep us safe and bring comfort." Also, National Dog Day celebrates dogs of all breeds.

Represented India in 185 matches and scored over 400 goals during his career, which stretched from 1926 to 1948.

**International Youth Day** is observed annually on August 12. It is meant as an opportunity for governments and others to draw attention to youth issues worldwide. During IYD, concerts, workshops, cultural events, and meetings involving national and local government officials and youth organizations take place around the world. IYD was designated by the United Nations in 1999 with the adoption of Resolution 54/120.



The theme for 2021 IYD is "Transforming Food Systems: Youth Innovation for Human and Planetary Health".

Janmashtami, the birth date of Lord Krishna, is widely celebrated across the country. This year, the auspicious day falls on August 30. Krishna, believed to be the eighth avatar of Lord Vishnu, was born on the eighth day (ashtami) of the Krishna Paksha (dark fortnight) of the month of Bhadrapad. The day is known by different names like 'Gokulashtami', 'Krishnashtami', 'Ashtami Rohini', 'Sree Javanthi' and 'Srikrishna Javanti'. Janmashtami





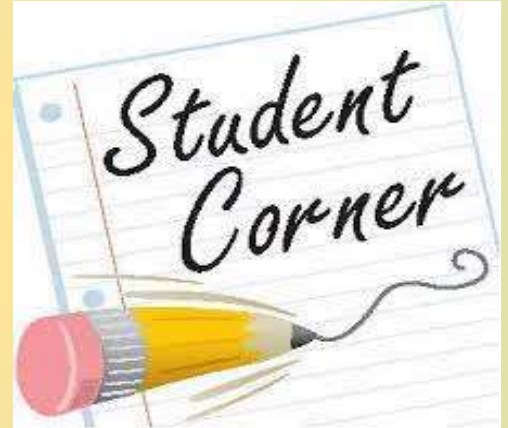

Moral: always remain cautious of cunning person.

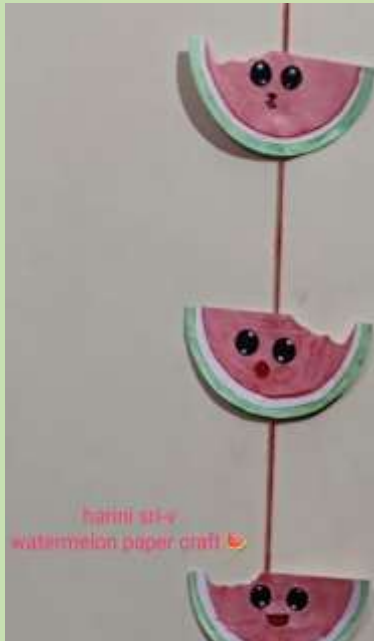

NASA scientists have found the outer boundary of solar system and called it the hydrogen wall. Earlier, the space was believed to be a continuous expanse of an imaginary sheet called ether.

The scientists working at NASA say that they have found the outer boundary of our solar system. It was earlier thought to be not properly defined. Now, they have said that their New Horizons spacecraft can see that invisible boundary. They have named it the "hydrogen wall." It is located at the edge of our solar system.

The sun keeps throwing out jets of matter and energy in the form of solar winds. They travel far beyond the orbit of Pluto. Till now scientists believed that the solar winds, beyond Pluto, merged with the galactic energy in space within our Milky Way galaxy.

New evidence points that the matter and energy carried by the solar winds accumulate in a particular region building hydrogen wall. It is the region where solar matter builds a formation with the interstellar matter. Hydrogen is the most common matter in space.

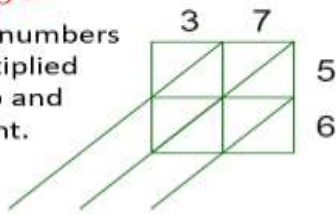

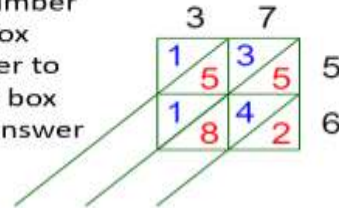

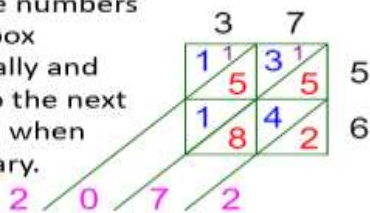

### Tokyo Olympics

India signed off the Tokyo games with seven medals - 1 in athletics, 2 in wrestling, 1 in weightlifting, 1 in hockey, 1 in boxing and 1 in badminton.

With this, India also went past the mark of 6 medals, which was the country's best ever medal haul at a single edition of the games before this (London, 2012) to register their most successful Olympic outing of all time.

Javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra won India's first ever track-and-field Olympic gold medal in Tokyo, while PV Sindhu won bronze in badminton, boxer Lovlina Borgohain won a bronze medal in boxing, the Indian men's hockey team broke a 41 year jinx by winning a bronze, Mirabai chanu won silver in weightlifting and wrestlers Ravi Dahiya and Bhaqrang Punia clinched silver and bronze respectively.
