Life becomes zero- a sum game. **Win-Win** sees life, as if it is a **cooperative arena**, not a competitive one.

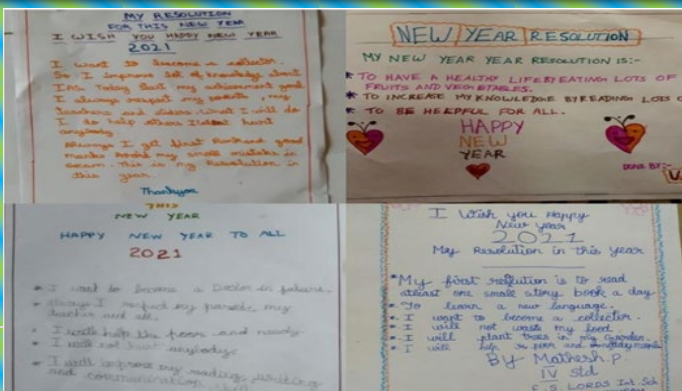
Win-Win is a frame of mind and heart that constantly seeks **mutual benefit** in all human interactions.

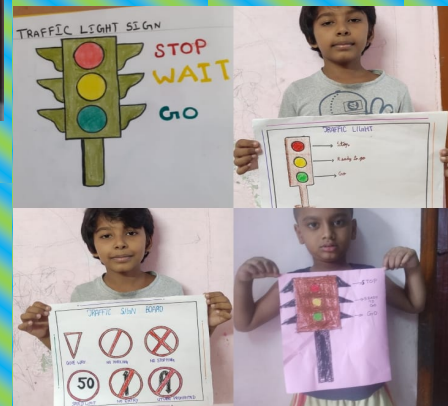

The National Road Safety Week is observed throughout the country every year to highlight and emphasize the need for safe roads.



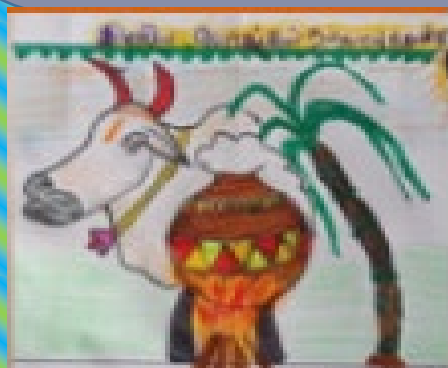
PONGAL CELEBRATIONS 14th-17th JANUARY

The four days of the Pongal festival are called Bhogi Pongal, Surya Pongal, Maattu Pongal and Kanum Pongal.

- Some people celebrate the fourth day of Pongal as Kanum Pongal.
- Pongal is a multi-day harvest festival of South India, particularly by the Tamilians.
- It is observed at the beginning start of the month Thai according to the Tamil solar calendar, and this is typically about January 14.

On Bhogi, people discard Old and derelict things and concentrate on new things causing changes or transformations.

- At dawn, people light a bonfire with logs of wood, other solid-fuels and wooden furniture at home that are no longer used.
- This festival is celebrated in Tamilnadu where the Chola kingdom had called it Puthyeedu linking it to the harvest season, nowadays the festival is being observed as Pongal.

• In Tamil, the word "Maadu" means bull and this day of Pongal is celebrated for cattle, in order to honour them.

• Particularly bulls that play a vital role by working hard to help the farmers to raise crops on their fields.

• The festival day is also a special occasion when the landlord and the peasant, rich and poor, old and young all dine together in a spirit of bonhomie without any restraint of caste and

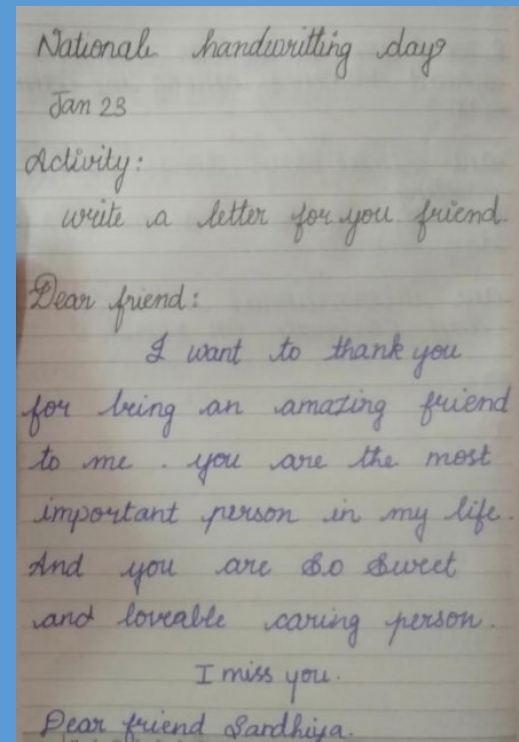
The fourth day of the three-day Pongal celebrations is called **Kaanum Pongal**. In few places this day is also known as **Karinaal** or **Thiruvalluvar Day**. It is dedicated to the sun god, **Surya** and has its roots in ancient Brahminical tradition.

The day of Kaanum Pongal is often acknowledged as the Thiruvalluvar Day in remembrance of the great historic Tamil writer, poet and philosopher. Thiruvalluvar who was known for his writing by the world famous Thirukural.

• The day is also popularly treated as the sightseeing day as well as Thanks giving day.

- However, the thesaurus also has its detractors.
- Whether you are looking for a more accurate word or trying to improve your writing, the thesaurus can be your best friend.
- Expanding your vocabulary increases both written and spoken communication skills, creative writing abilities, and can be helpful in advancing your career.

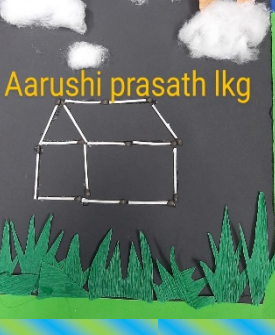
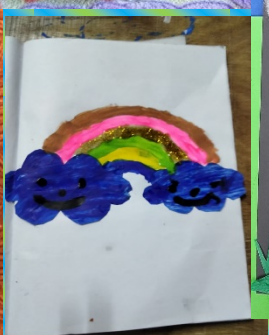
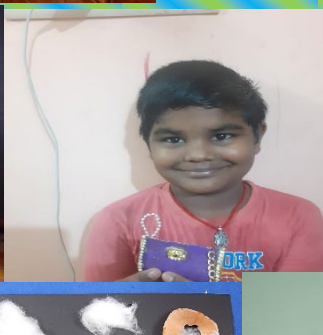
Republic day of India

Republic Day is celebrated every year in India on 26th January to commemorate the date on which the Constitution of India came into effect, in the year 1950, and the country became a republic.

- India became independent on 15th August 1947 — but it was not a date that India had chosen for itself, rather it was thrust upon by Lord Louis Mountbatten, as it marked the second anniversary of Japan's submission to allied powers after World War II.
- While India became independent from British Raj following the Indian Independence movement, it didn't have a constitution of its own.
- Indian laws were based on a modified version of the British established, Government of India Act 1935.
- Two weeks later, a Drafting Committee with Dr B R Ambedkar as chairman was appointed for drafting a permanent Indian Constitution.
- Although the Constitution was adopted on November 26, 1949, it came into force on January 26, 1950 - a day chosen by Indians for themselves for it held immense significance for the country.

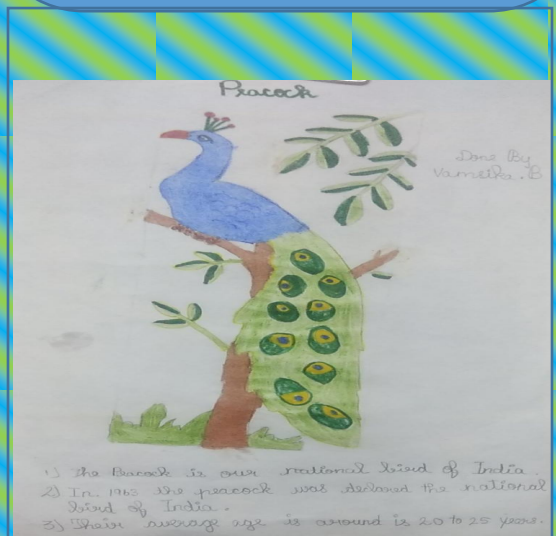
Hindi is related to the origin of the Hindi word 'Sindhu'. Sindhu is called 'Sindh' river. The area around the Indus river is called Indus Pradesh. The Sanskrit word 'Sindhu' came into contact with Iranians and became Hindu or hind. In this Hind word pronounced by Iranians, the use of one suffix of Iranian language has made the word 'Hindu' which means 'of Hind'. The Greek word ' * indica' or * the English word 'India' is the developed form of this 'Hindu'.

The literature of * Hindi is* derived from 1000 AD. Earlier literature received is in Apabhraṃś , it can be considered as the former chair of Hindi.

Science corner - First wooden satellite

- ❖ A Japanese company and Kyoto University have joined forces to develop what they hope will be the world's first satellites made out of wood by 2023.
- ❖ Sumitomo Forestry said it has started research on tree growth and the use of wood materials in space.
- ❖ The partnership will begin experimenting with different types of wood in extreme environments on Earth.
- ❖ Space junk is becoming an increasing problem as more satellites are launched into the atmosphere.
- ❖ Wooden satellites would burn up without releasing harmful substances into the atmosphere or raining debris on the ground when they plunge back to Earth.
- ❖ Sumitomo Forestry, part of the Sumitomo Group, which was founded more than 400 years ago, said it would work on developing wooden materials highly resistant to temperature changes and sunlight.
- ❖ Satellites are increasingly being used for communication, television, navigation and weather forecasting. Space experts and researchers have been investigating different options to remove and reduce the space junk.
- ❖ There are nearly 6,000 satellites circling Earth, according to the World Economic Forum (WEF). About 60% of them are defunct (space junk).
- ❖ Research firm Euroconsult estimates that 990 satellites will be launched every year this decade, which means that by 2028, there could be 15,000 satellites in orbit.
- ❖ Space junk travels at an incredibly fast speed of more than 22,300 mph, so can have cause considerable damage to any objects it hits.
- ❖ In 2006 a tiny piece of space junk collided with the International Space Station, taking a chip out of the heavily reinforced window.
